5. Facility Development

Eric stated that field use revenue is to be discussed with the diamond and regular field users on how to spend the funds, the amount being \$12,288. Softball and baseball will also be requested to come up with a wish list. The funds are for capital improvements only. The rectangular field users amount being \$43,202 this includes lacrosse, rugby, soccer etc and is for natural turf fields only. The artificial turf field users fees goes into a replacement fund. Sammy will be setting up meetings in June. Funds were confirmed to be from the 2008 calendar year i.e. January thru December.

6. BC Seniors Games

Jim confirmed that the equestrian event has been withdrawn from the games and Pickleball will be added as a demonstration sport with 3 teams of four players each.

Games Office is open between 10 am and 2 pm each day and the web page is up and running. The majority of the events will be held at the Oval and Minoru Park and 4200 athletes are expected to attend.

Eric drew a plan of the main activity floor and the ice area, court area and indoor training track and stated that there had been a lot of discussion on the post Olympic activity for generating revenue.
